The deadline for public representations to the SCC will be 13 <sup>th</sup> September. (Please note, it will be <u>many</u> months before the QLS Wave 3 is actually implemented across the county).	
Discovering Suffolk	No further developments to report about the two-year project called Discovering Suffolk based within the Green Access Team at Suffolk County Council.	
Highways Cutting Schedule	The annual cutting allocation by Highways for the Parish does need to be reviewed. In comparison with the much more generous Essex cutting allocation for Bures Hamlet, it appears to be somewhat inadequate.
