AONB Joint Advisory Committee Meeting

On 3rd November I attended the meeting of the AONB JAC, which included presentations on staff activity; national activity and a financial update. A significant imminent change in legislation (subject to Royal Assent on 7th November) was highlighted: the Levelling up and Regeneration Bill will amend Section 85 of the Countryside & Rights of Way Act so as to strengthen the obligations of developers and public bodies towards nationally significant landscapes.
